

# Inventory of the Eugene Clyde La Rue Photos at the Huntington Library, San Marino, California

## DESCRIPTION:

DLR viewed four boxes, one of stereos plus 3 others. Many photos and negatives are unlabelled and undated. Many prints and their negatives may be in separate boxes and folders making it difficult to get an accurate inventory in a short time period, particularly when most are unlabelled and undated. There are many prints and negatives that are labelled, particularly those connected with the Colorado River surveys. Many of these sites are now underwater from Boulder and Glen Canyon dams. The following is a fairly comprehensive listing of the photographic material DLR looked at in 4 boxes of this collection.

Summary of DLR findings:
