

Former University of Arizona (UA) students who have been disqualified or who have left on probation are not guaranteed readmission to the UA. If you plan to apply for readmission to Geosciences, you must meet these departmental requirements:

1) To be eligible for consideration for readmission after disqualification, students must complete at least 24 transferrable units with a GPA of 3.0 or higher from another institution. These units should represent two semesters of a full-time (i.e., 12 or more units) academic load.

2) Upon completion of at least 24 units of transferrable coursework, students must reapply to the UA and submit full transcripts for review. Readmission will be determined, on a case-by-case basis, by the dean of the College of Science.

3) Applications for readmission will not be considered if a student has not made some satisfactory progress towards Geosciences degree requirements. For a typical student, and depending on previously completed coursework, this could potentially include: 1) two semesters of calculus; 2) two semesters of physics; 3) two semesters of chemistry; 4) a second language course; 5) English; 6) statistics; and 7) general education courses as needed. Applicants whose coursework has not addressed these areas will not be considered. Students who are uncertain about their remaining degree requirements should contact an academic advisor.
